The end of the "End". That's where we are. And it matters.

The last two chapters of Revelation describe an end even more glorious than the beginning, which is hard to do. And, ironically, it isn't even the "end"! It is a new beginning. Genesis 1-3 describes the story of a man who failed to choose righteousness in the midst of a perfect existence. The rest of the Bible unfolds the expectation and fulfillment of a Man who would choose righteousness in the midst of a depraved and corrupted existence. Revelation 21-22 reveals what His (and our) reward is as a result.

**Main Point**

If, by faith, we see where God is taking us, it helps us understand the significance and anticipation of where He has us today. Consider the following questions and passages in light of Revelation 21-22 promises.

- With the backdrop of *From Beginning To End*, what do you think Paul is saying in Ephesians 1:3 about being seated in heavenly places.?
- We expect God to eternally dwell among men. Jesus came to dwell among us. Our bodies are called God's temple. How do you bring together all these images of God dwelling among us today? (John 1:14-18; 2 Corinthians 6:16-18)
- What is your greatest hope from Revelation 21:4?
- Twice in chapters 21 and 22, the idea of free access to water is emphasized (21:7; 22:17). How does that go with Jesus conversation with the Samaritan woman in John 4:7-10?
- What is remaining for us to confess the final three words of Revelation 22:20, "Come, Lord Jesus"? Why are things on this corrupted earth and in this sinful existence more valuable than the hope of perfection awaiting us?



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
