**Open**

Proverbs 15:8 says that God delights in the prayer of the upright. Certainly Jesus instructing His disciples on the subject of prayer would help them meet the standard required to bring His Father complete satisfaction. No doubt through careful examination of "the Lord's Prayer" an explanation for a divinely pleasing prayer will be seen.

**Main Point**

A fuller understanding of Jesus' foundational teaching about prayer will help us reach the "prayer of the upright."

**Read**

Proverbs 15:8; Matthew 6:5-13

**Discuss**

- Based on Matthew 6:5-8, what are some of the first ingredients of a righteous prayer?
- What is the general principle described in vv. 9-10? How would you say this in a prayer of your own?
- Verse 11 demonstrates a simple request for daily provision. Would this be consistent with our prayers of provision? In what was it not consistent?
- The last two verses (vv. 12-13) illustrate the practice of confession. If Jesus' essential teaching on prayer includes it, how regular of a practice should it be? How important is community confession (v. 12) to God?
- How often should the Lord's Prayer be recited by individuals or the Church? What is its value today?



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
